

THE GOOD SAMARITAN

BIBLE READING PLAN

The Parable of the Good Samaritan is far and away Jesus' best known parable.

Asked by a religious expert to define who qualifies as a neighbor, Jesus tells this fictional story about a traveler who is stripped of clothing, beaten, and left half dead alongside the road. First a Jewish priest and then a Levite comes by, but both avoid the man. Finally, a Samaritan happens upon the traveler. Although Samaritans and Jews despised each other, the Samaritan helps the injured man. Jesus' conclusion, of course, is that the neighbor is the one who shows mercy to the injured fellow man.

This parable and its essential insight that everyone is our neighbor and worthy of love are the foundation of much of Christian ethics. However, the Parable of the Good Samaritan is a long ways from being the *only* biblical teaching on our ethical duty to love and care for others.

This two-week reading plan will lead you on a wide-ranging journey that will ultimately show you that loving and caring for others is a central theme not just of Jesus' teachings but of our scriptures as a whole.
